2. Course Description:

This summer camp is a summer program that combines Lasallian Social Entrepreneurship and Innovation with a focus on food security. Lasallian Social Entrepreneurship is a multi-sectoral, multidisciplinary, and innovative approach to development that aims to address community social problems by utilizing concrete and inclusive business models anchored in the principles of sustainable development. This definition is guided by three important elements, namely:

- Inclusive Ownership Structure- inclusion of community members in the ownership structure of social enterprises as co-owners and not just mere beneficiaries, laborers, or suppliers.
- Quality Participation- equitable participation of community members, students, and other stakeholders from the planning up to the business operation stage of the social enterprise.
- Equitable Valuation- proper valuation of non-monetary contributions of all stakeholders of the community social enterprises.

On the other hand, innovation sessions introduce participants to innovation and human-centered design in food security challenges. This session will guide attendees in identifying key issues in the food system from production to accessibility and affordability. Participants will learn to use design thinking frameworks to conduct needs finding in food security and accessibility.
